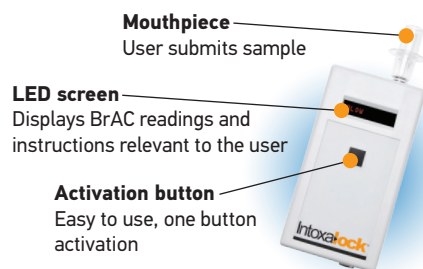
HOW CAN I GET MY LICENSE BACK?

If you are reading this brochure, it is likely that you or a loved one has been pulled over for Driving While Impaired (DWI). Getting an ignition interlock device installed in your vehicle is an important step in regaining your license in Louisiana. This brochure will take you through all the necessary steps based on your offense and will assist you in getting back on the road quickly and legally.*

WHAT IS AN IGNITION INTERLOCK?

An ignition interlock device (IID) integrates breath alcohol testing with your vehicle's ignition system. Prior to starting your vehicle, you will need to submit a breath sample into the hand held portion of the device that tests for the presence of alcohol. If your Breath Alcohol Concentration (BrAC) is below Louisiana's ignition interlock limit (0.030), your vehicle will start. If alcohol is detected, your vehicle will not start until a passing sample has been provided.

FIRST OFFENSE DWI

If you were convicted of a first offense DWI in Louisiana, your license will be suspended for 90 days to two years if your blood alcohol content is above 0.20 percent. You may be eligible for a hardship license after 30 days. A restricted license may be issued in many cases if the driver agrees to the installation of an Intoxalock ignition interlock or BAID device for the period of suspension.

SECOND OFFENSE DWI

If you were convicted of a second offense DWI in Louisiana, your license will be suspended for one year without eligibility for a hardship license. Your license will be suspended for four years if your blood alcohol content is above 0.20 percent and will require a mandatory three years of an Intoxalock ignition interlock or BAID device installation.

THIRD & SUBSEQUENT OFFENSES DWI

If you were convicted of a third offense DWI in Louisiana, your license will be suspended for one year without eligibility for a hardship license. Your license will be suspended for four years if your blood alcohol content is above 0.20 percent and will require a mandatory three years of an Intoxalock ignition interlock or BAID device installation.

REFUSAL OF A CHEMICAL TEST

First refusal

Your driving privileges will be suspended for one year if you refuse to alcohol testing. You may be eligible for a hardship license in many cases if you agree to the installation of an Intoxalock ignition interlock or BAID device for the period of suspension.

Second and subsequent refusals

Your driving privileges will be suspended for two years if you refuse to alcohol testing in addition to a prior refusal. You may be eligible for a hardship license in many cases if you agree to the installation of an Intoxalock ignition interlock or BAID device for the period of suspension.

- A refusal with a previous suspension on the driving record for refusal, submit to the chemical test for intoxication, submit Underage, DWI, UDUI or Vehicular

Negligent Injury. The Supreme Court ruled on October 16, 2012 that if there is a refusal on a record with a prior alcohol related offense, installing the interlock as a condition of reinstatement is no longer required, unless the refusal resulted in a DWI conviction.

- A BAC of 0.08% or above received within five years of a previous suspension on the driving record for Refusal, submit to the chemical test for intoxication, submit Underage, DWI, UDUI or Vehicular Negligent Injury.
- A BAC of 0.08% or above or a Refusal involving an accident with serious bodily injury or, substantial risk of death.
- A BAC of 0.08% or above or refusal where there was a passenger in the vehicle 12 years of age or younger.

IID REQUIREMENT CRITERIA

In order to reinstate your driving privileges, please contact the Louisiana Department of Public Safety at (225) 925-6146 to determine when you are eligible for reinstatement or a restricted hardship license. Also, make sure to obtain your SR22 insurance if needed usually due to a Refusal. Once you have served your suspension and you are eligible for reinstatement. Contact Intoxalock to schedule your installation appointment. Remember, once your installation is complete, you must provide your lease agreement and certificate of installation as proof that your ignition interlock is installed.

- The ignition interlock device must be installed in all vehicles the driver will be operating prior to reinstatement of the driving privileges.
- As a condition of reinstatement, the ignition interlock device must remain installed for the duration of the suspension of driving privileges with a minimum requirement of 180 days. If a restricted interlock license was issued at any time during the suspension period, credit will be given for the time the interlock device was installed.

NOTE: The suspension or revocation time period associated with an alcohol-related offense, or refusal, may be longer than the requirement to have the ignition interlock device. If an offender chooses to remove the device prior to the end of their suspension or revocation period, their driving privileges will again be withdrawn until the suspension or revocation period ends and all re-licensing requirements are met.

CALIBRATIONS

The state of Louisiana requires that all ignition interlock devices be calibrated every 60 days. A calibration consists of exchanging your current device for a newly calibrated one, ensuring accurate and consistent testing.

Intoxalock auto-calibrations

Intoxalock offers its customers auto-calibrations in the state of Louisiana. When your current device is due for calibration, the LED screen will display a message alerting you it is time to exchange devices. Intoxalock will automatically send a new one to your selected service center. You simply need to visit your service center during the allotted calibration period and a technician will quickly exchange the device.
