Unexpected 2014 Legislative Season

This year's legislation has proven to be much more active than anyone would have anticipated. Even numbered years are the second year of states' biennial sessions and election years. Both of these suppress the amount of legislation introduced and passed. Those are also the years in which eight states have shortened to budget-only sessions and another four states, Montana, Nevada, North Dakota, and Texas have no session at all. 2014 was slated to be a light year for ignition interlock legislation... if it had followed the trend.

That being said, eight states are still in a year-round legislative session and passed legislation has already tied 2013 as the most prolific year for ignition interlock law changes. Year to date, 15 bills have hit the desks of Governors all across the country. There is a decent chance that another will pass and break the record.

Some of the bills include major pieces of legislation. Indiana went from a program with minimal sanctions to one that requires

ignition interlocks for all offenders. Connecticut also joined the ranks of the "all offenders required" program states. Idaho mandated that every repeat offender install an ignition interlock. Florida dumped their exclusive interlock provider system and opened the entire state up to all interlock companies. Lastly, Mississippi made substantial improvements to their year old law requiring driver's license suspension times.

What does next year hold for ignition interlocks?

All eyes are on the west coast as California's massive four county first offenders Pilot Program is set to expire at the end of the year. Will it sunset? Will it be extended? Or will it be expanded statewide and made permanent? Given California's size, the stakes are huge. ■
